

  - vertically aligned, K-5





- Build off of prior units (vertically aligned)

## PYP aims to develop International Mindedness

Students learn to recognize their common humanity, shared guardianship of the planet and help to create a better and more peaceful world. This is accomplished through the Learner Profile Attributes & Attitudes.

## Attributes of the LEARNER PROFILE

- at the heart of the PYP program who we are as learners, friends, family members and people of the world
- characteristics that teachers all around the world agree a student needs to change the world.
- Action students take to be an internationally minded student.



## **Classroom Management**

- Classroom essential agreements
- Emphasis on approaches to learning, learner profile, attitudes, and action cycle
- Classroom reward system (individual, table and whole class)
- Consequences: walking laps at recess;

## **Grading Policy**

- All graded work must be done at school
- Students will have an opportunity to redo any assignment for a grade of up to 70%
- 10 points may be deducted from the grade for late work
- Minimum 7 grades per core subject per nine weeks
- Grading categories:
  - Classwork/Daily Grades 70%
  - Assessments 30%
